



JUBILEE YEAR "For it is a jubilee; it shall be holy to you." Leviticus 25:12

In 2023, our Eparchy is celebrating its Golden Jubilee, marking 50 years of Maronites in Australia, under the theme *The Maronites in Australia: A Journey of Holiness and Openness*.

The emblem for the Golden Jubilee embodies the essence of our faith and spirituality, and reflects the journey of the Maronites across the seas to this vast land. At the centre are three persons, a symbol of the Holy Trinity, on a sailing ship forging forward, representing the Maronite people, who are always open to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. The colours are those of our Lebanese flag, symbolising the sacrifice of our people, with the addition of blue to represent Our Mother, who accompanies the Maronites on all our journeys, especially across the oceans.

To mark this momentous occasion, the relics of five Saints — Saints Maroun, Charbel, Rafka, Nemetallah and Mary MacKillop — visited our Parish, and the entire Eparchy will gather with our Patriarch, Cardinal Bechara Boutros Al-Rahi, for a special Golden Jubilee Mass at Homebush on September 24, and a dinner at Rosehill Gardens on September 21.





ABOUT US SAINT JOSEPH'S MARONITE CATHOLIC CHURCH

"Saint Joseph was a just man, a tireless worker, the upright guardian of those entrusted to his care. May he always guard, protect and enlighten families." - St John Paul II

For over 40 years, Saint Joseph's Maronite Catholic Church has been home to thousands of Maronite families in and around Croydon. A Church that once belonged to the Baptist denomination, it was sold to the Maronite Catholic community and consecrated by His Grace, Archbishop Abdo Khalife, on December 19, 1978. For the next ten years, the Church served around 300 Maronite Catholic families.

By the early 1990s, a bigger Church was needed to cater for the growing parish. During building, Divine Liturgy was celebrated downstairs until the top part of the Church was completed and opened by His Excellency, Bishop Joseph Hitti in 1998.

In 2000, the Parish expanded with the purchase of a number of surrounding houses, and new rooms were established in the downstairs hall to serve youth and children. By 2005, the Parish was serving several thousand members, had a number of Priests, a Deacon and various committees. A childcare centre opened in 2022, and the Parish continued to expand and implement new initiatives.

Today, the Parish is home to thousands of parishioners. Through the grace of the Holy Spirit and guidance of Saint Joseph, Foster Father to Our Lord Jesus, Spouse to Our Mother Mary and Patron of Workers and the Universal Church, we strive to protect families and help people contribute to the wider community.

PARISH COMMITTEES



STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

Over the past year, Saint Joseph's Stewardship Committee has worked tirelessly with a vision centred around improving the Parish's longevity and growth for the benefit of future generations. Through enhanced financial management, legal guidance, structural development and embracing new technologies, the Committee has successfully laid a solid foundation for the Parish's continued progress. Additionally, by fostering improved cooperation among other committees, the Stewardship Committee has laid a solid groundwork for Saint Joseph's continued commitment to preserving our Maronite heritage, while building a thriving community for generations to come.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

The Parish Pastoral Council is comprised of members from all the committees who assist the clergy with the day-to-day running of the Parish. At their monthly meetings, the Council organises events, share updates on previous Parish activities, and workshop ways to support the various committees who are serving our growing Parish family.

Their Christmas 2022 festival was a huge success, as was the inaugural family dinner night held during the 2023 Saint Joseph's feast week, which raised over \$100,000.



SODALITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

With Mary as their model, the Sodality works to deepen their faith and live it more fully. They hold rosary evenings, weekly prayer and Divine Liturgy, pray their special office before Sunday 8am Mass, and lead daily rosary before 9am and 6pm Masses.

Over the last year, the Sodality has overseen visits to Berrima and other shrines, and run monthly tea and coffee mornings after Sunday 8am Mass.

YOUTH COMMITTEE

This committee strives to strengthen the Maronite faith of our youth, and enhance the spiritual and social aspects of Parish life. With an understanding of the challenges faced by our young parishioners, they aim to support their needs and nourish spirituality.

The Youth, Media, Teens, Fersen and CAFF committees held a combined leadership retreat in October 2022, and a spiritual retreat with Our Lady of Lebanon in February 2023. They also organised a walk from Saint Joseph to Saint Charbel in July 2022, *From Bethlem to Annaya*, and the annual Youth dinner dance in April 2023 raised over \$90,000.





MEDIA COMMITTEE

Our Media Committee aims to provide and promote Maronite Catholic values online. From organising Parish photography, videos and flyers, to website building, the work is constant and rewarding. In 2023, the team oversaw the Parish logo redesign, the continual updating of the Parish's social media feeds, and established a community WhatsApp group to ensure those not on social media are kept informed on Parish news and upcoming events.

SENIORS CONMITTEE

This committee meets monthly and stays in touch with its 55 members via a WhatsApp group. Over the last year, they organised bus trips, movie nights, held a Christmas party with the other seniors committees from various Maronite parishes, and invited all Maronite seniors committees to a gathering to mark Saint Joseph's feast. They also celebrated Mother's Day in May and Grandparents Day in July, with a morning tea at the Parish.

LADIES CONNITTEE

Working closely with the clergy, this committee is geared towards active service within our community and is involved in nearly every event at the Parish. In 2023, these women oversaw the sweets, *hrissi* and catering on offer during the celebrations for Saint Joseph's feast week and other major feast days of the Maronite liturgical calendar, and baked the *mneish* for the monthly breakfast served to parishioners following Sunday morning Mass services.





LITURGICAL COMMITTEE

This committee promotes the full and active participation of the faithful in liturgical celebrations. Among their duties: preparing for liturgical events, sacraments and paraliturgical services, providing and preparing Priests' vestments and Altar Servers' robes, overseeing Church décor including altar linens, icons and presentations for Mass, running choir and altar service rehearsals, and organising ushers and lectors for major celebrations.

FAITH AND LIGHT COMMITTEE

This committee is part of an international movement that brings together those with special needs, their families, carers and friends, to express compassion and community. They pray and celebrate the Divine Liturgy together, organise tailored activities and games, host events to encourage and build friendships, and undertake home visits for special occasions.

This year, the committee restarted home visits and gatherings for those with special needs and their families, with Priests bringing the Eucharist into their homes.





MARIAN APOSTOLIC MOVEMENT

The MAM strive to follow the example of Mary in her obedience, service and humility. Their weekly meetings include Bible discussions, conversation around current social issues, and learning more about Catholic Church teachings and our Maronite traditions. This year saw the establishment of the Lectio Divina on the first Monday of every month, and a renewal of their commitment to Our Lady and the MAM on Pentecost Sunday.

CATHOLIC ADULT FAITH FORMATION

This committee works to keep our Parish adults faithful to the Gospel, Maronite traditions and teachings of the Church, and to develop a personal relationship with God, respond to His call to holiness, and enable an ongoing conversion to Jesus in holiness of life. CAFF held a retreat in 2022, in addition to running both single and multi-part courses throughout the year, diving deeper on issues of faith, the Bible and the lives of the Saints. Guest speakers included Milad Khalil, who discussed the theology of the body, and Deacon Harold.





FAMILY OF THE DIVINE WORD

This committee is centred around the Gospel and weekly, clergy-led Arabic Bible study sessions to foster spiritual growth and understanding of the Old and New Testaments.

Their Wednesday evening sessions hosted guest speakers, including those from other Maronite parishes and other churches, and they organised overnight spiritual retreats for committee members, their family and friends.

FAMILY CONMITTEE

Promoting family values among parents and the spiritual, social and communal aspects of families, the married couples in this committee work to foster positive relationships with Parish children, youth and teens.

Over the last year, they ran a family rosary every Friday during October, hosted a Christmas movie night, held a marriage renewal Mass in January, oversaw a Lenten program including weekly reflections and Friday afternoon Stations of the Cross catered to families and young children, and organised family brunches after Sunday morning Masses, including one to marl the World Day of Families in May.





ARABIC SCHOOL

Saint Joseph's Community Language Centre is a government-recognised centre for Arabic learning, with four qualified teachers catering for both primary and high school students. The Centre encourages students to have pride in their Lebanese culture and to use Arabic to communicate with their family, Parish and community.

Friday classes are divided into four levels, from beginner to advanced. Students learn Arabic speaking, reading and writing through activities such as singing, drama performance and interactive learning programs within the classroom.

FERSEN AL ADRA

This group helps develop the spiritual formation of our Parish children, so that they come to know, live and love their Maronite Catholic faith. They look to the example of the Mother of God, and make a promise to Mary to live this commitment faithfully.

The committee organised monthly Fersen Masses, fundraisers (the children made and sold cupcakes) and special gifts for parishioners, like Mother's Day and Father's Day gift bags. The committee also participated in the Diocesan Fersen Day, when all the Eparchy's Fersen children came together at Saint George in Thornleigh for a fun day.





MARONITE FLAME TEENS

Eight volunteers hold classes every Saturday afternoon for around 80 Parish high school students. They also organise social events throughout the year including a bonfire, retreat for spiritual growth and social interaction, WhatsApp group for the teens and their parents, and a *hafle* for the feast day of Saint Joseph.

Over the year, sessions were predominantly based on the Maronite seasons and Liturgical Cycle, with a focus on Gospel readings and discussions around the Mass and rosary. Each session featured question time to encourage teens to think more deeply about subjects.

CHARITIES

Although our Maronites on Mission weekly food run in Villawood ended in February 2023 due to a council decision, the MOM continue to provide monthly home visits and spend time with those in our community with disabilities.

The 2023 winter appeal collected warm clothing for the homeless, which was distributed by the youth of Saint Joseph, and we also had members of our Parish participate in missionary work in the Philippines.





HOLY COMMUNION COMMITTEE

Every year, the children of Saint Joseph make their First Communion in September, at a special Mass celebrated by the Bishop.

In 2022, there were close to 50 children enrolled. From June to October, the children met on Thursday nights for a five-week course on the sacrament of Reconciliation, and an eightweek course on the sacrament of the Eucharist. Parents were also instructed and formed over three sessions, to familiarise them with the program and help them foster faith in their children.

LILIES OF SAINT JOSEPH

One of the newer committees in our Parish, the Lilies have tripled their membership in just one year. A prayer group devoted to Saint Joseph, they meet monthly to celebrate Mass together and discuss ways to support the Parish, and upkeep of the Church. Their work encompasses initiating projects and activities for Parish women, uplifting the needy through social activities, and running personal enrichment programs. They produced rosary bracelets for feast week celebrations in March, and held their first Mother's Day cruise in May, with all proceeds going toward the upkeep of the Church altar including candles, candelabras, altar cloths and general housekeeping.





MEN'S GROUP

A new committee in the Parish, this formation group meets on the last Wednesday of every month, and offers a space where men can come together to connect with like-minded males and grow in their relationship with God, their family and the Church. The group is comprised of both single and married men, and looks to Saint Joseph for guidance on how to be a faithfilled and faithful man in today's world.

Over the last year, the group has held numerous testimony talks, offering insights and discussions on how to live as a moral and righteous man - like Saint Joseph - and what it means to be a Catholic man today.

SAFEGUARDING

We are delighted to announce the establishment of a dedicated Safeguarding Committee within our Parish, focused on ensuring the highest standards of safeguarding for our parishioners, especially children, the elderly and the vulnerable. This committee has been formed in strict accordance with the recommendations set forth by the Royal Commission and the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards. By proactively addressing safeguarding concerns, we aim to create a safe and nurturing environment for all parishioners. The Committee's vigilant oversight, implementation of robust policies and ongoing training will foster trust, provide accountability, and ultimately benefit our entire Parish.



FUTURE PROJECTS

Over the last year, we have made significant progress on the Saint Joseph Youth and Community Centre.

Burwood Council has generously agreed that we can lodge a DA without first lodging a planning proposal, and we anticipate that this exemption has erased approximately two years off the project start date.

Now, with God's grace and the continued support of our parishioners, we are working toward a start date of mid-2024.

In addition to moving ahead with the Youth and Community Centre, we are also planning some alterations and additions to the Church itself, including:

- Building an active Church-front on Wychbury Avenue that will incorporate a foyer
- Installing lead light windows along the wall behind the altar (Wychbury Avenue side of the Church)
- Installing a dome on the Church roof

FUNDRAISING


In 2022, the Stewardship Committee hosted the first Annual Fundraiser Gala and oversaw the auction of a Porsche, which collectively raised over \$850,000. In addition to this event, the Parish has hosted several other fundraisers including the Christmas Festival, an Easter raffle, and Saint Joseph's Feast Week activities.

The Parish is now preparing for the 2023 Annual Fundraiser Gala at Montage, where prizes include a BMW car, a SeaDoo jet ski and a diamond necklace.

Monies raised via the various fundraising opportunities have been used to reduce the overall debt of the Parish, undertake crucial maintenance of Parish grounds, and commence the legal and administrative process of building the Saint Joseph's Youth and Community Centre.

Saint Joseph's Maronite Catholic Church is blessed to have a generous and committed community of parishioners who work tirelessly to support the Parish in every way possible. The fundraising activities of the Parish are a crucial aspect of ensuring the longevity and growth of Saint Joseph's for future generations.

GIFT SHOP

The Saint Joseph Gift Shop has expanded exponentially over the last 12 months, both in size and stock. We now have a dedicated stock room in the basement car park, and a new POS system to keep better track of inventory and run a comprehensive stocktake every three to six months.

Alongside the religious icons and statues, the shop now offers religious apparel, which have become particularly popular with our youth. During Holy Week 2023, from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, the Gift Shop raised \$40,000.
